RECERTIFICATION COURSES

PALS Recertification Skills Session

The Pediatric Advanced Life Support course, or PALS, provides participants with the knowledge and skills on how to care for children and infants who are experiencing a medical emergency. Issues such as pediatric assessment and resuscitation, respiratory emergencies, and shock are essential components of this course. NEW 2025: To Attend this SKILLS VALIDATION you must first register with the American Heart Association and complete the Heartcode PALS online program (approx 5 hrs and separate fee to the AHA.) YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TAKE THE SKILLS SESSION WITHOUT FIRST COMPLETING THE FULL ONLINE COURSE. NO EXCEPTIONS. Link: <https://elearning.heart.org/course/439>

ACLS with BLS Completion Skills Session

Designed for healthcare professionals with a basic EKG knowledge, this ACLS program creates a less stress approach to dealing with cardiovascular emergencies; from oxygenation and airway management to AMI recognition and the nationally recognized cardiac arrest algorithms, while making this relevant to the Dental practice. To Register for this course you must first register with the American Heart Association. NEW 2025: To Attend this SKILLS VALIDATION you must first register with the American Heart Association and complete the Heartcode ACLS online program (approx 4 hrs and separate fee to the AHA.) YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TAKE THE SKILLS SESSION WITHOUT FIRST COMPLETING THE FULL ONLINE COURSE. NO EXCEPTIONS. Link: <https://elearning.heart.org/course/438>

Management of Medical and Airway Emergencies in the Dental Practice (OBEAM Equivalent)

The course will provide didactic, video, and case-based hands-on skills labs dealing with medical and airway emergencies possible in the dental and sedation settings. Participants will review, practice, and demonstrate proficiency in managing emergencies including, but not limited to, respiratory distress and failure, using bag mask, oral and nasal airways, perilyngeal devices, as well as intubation and cricothyrotomy. Recognizing and treating emergencies such as cardiac events, stroke, syncope, seizures, allergic reactions, and laryngospasm will be reviewed and practiced.

This course meets the requirements for the Florida Board of Dentistry and AAOMS for office management and simulation has been endorsed as an equivalent program to the AAOMS National Simulation Program. Completion of this course fulfills the necessary simulation for AAOMS membership. Verification of compliance of successful anesthesia simulation training will be through the OAE program.

Shaun Fix has been practicing and teaching in the hospital and pre-hospital field since 1983. He is the president of Emergency Medical Consultants, Inc. and served 35 years as a company officer in charge of Emergency Medicine for Boca Raton Fire Rescue Services in the Palm Beach area of South Florida. Our team has been presenting Management of Office Emergencies for Dental Professionals since the 90's and along with Dental Specialty ACLS courses, helped present the original curriculum for the Dental Airway Course with members of the FSOMS board. We have presented at FSOMS, FAP, and Florida Dental board conferences. Shaun has presented programs at State, National and International Conferences and has appeared on FETN, Pulse, 24-7 EMS, Medic

Monthly, and Emergency Medical Update videos. A frequent lecturer, author and consultant, Shaun and his group are best known for keeping their programs upbeat and relevant while bringing "the reality of emergency medicine" to the classroom setting and providing onsite relevant training based on the providers specific needs.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



DAVID KLINGMAN, DMD

Dr. Klingman was born and raised near West Point, NY and attended college at the State University of New York at Stony Brook, majoring in Biochemistry and minoring in Linguistics. After completing dental school at UMDNJ-New Jersey Dental School (now Rutgers School of Dental Medicine) and completing two years of hospital based dental residency at University Hospital, Newark NJ, and 5 years as an associate dentist in private practice, Dr. Klingman entered service in the United States Air Force in 2003, deploying in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM. During his service, Dr. Klingman and his family lived in multiple states and on Okinawa, Japan.

Having completed seven assignments, including residencies and board certification in both Comprehensive Dentistry and Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, Dr. Klingman has retired after 20 years of military service and brings over a decade of teaching experience, as an Associate Professor at Uniformed Services University and Adjunct Associate Professor at West Virginia School of Dental Medicine, to Pacific Northwest University School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Klingman has had a particularly strong interest in educational content development and delivery, teacher-learner interaction, and teaching through a mentorship model.

SURGICAL PATHOLOGY: AN INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

Dr. Moe is an Assistant Professor and the Associate Director of Head & Neck Oncologic and Microvascular Reconstructive Surgery Fellowship in the Department of Surgery, Section of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Moe graduated from Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta GA and from Dalhousie University School of Dentistry in Halifax NS. She completed internships at the University of California, Los Angeles and at Emory University. Dr. Moe obtained her residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Emory University. She completed the fellowship in Head and Neck Oncologic and Microvascular Surgery at the University of Michigan. Clinical Specialization:

Dr. Moe specializes in the treatment of head and neck cancer and non-cancerous tumors. Her clinical practice focuses on the comprehensive rehabilitation for facial deformities and tumor resection surgeries including reconstructive surgery, dental implant rehabilitation and facial cosmetic procedures.
